



Homework Expectations

While students are able to complete their homework without assistance, additional support will enrich their learning.

Student Responsibilities:

- Take note of the homework in the student planner.
- Complete (or make a genuine attempt to complete) set tasks by the due date.
- Contact teacher if absent from class and complete (or make an attempt to complete) work missed during your absence.
- Seek assistance and feedback when difficulties occur.
- Develop good study skills which will support your growth as a lifelong learner.
- Complete additional study homework as required.
- Discuss with guardians the homework expectations.
- Organise your time to ensure a balance between homework and other priorities.

Teacher Responsibilities:

- Set homework that is meaningful; it should contribute to the development of the student.
- Have clear expectations of what is expected in terms of regular homework in their class. This will vary from subject to subject (eg. theoretical and practical subjects). This could be daily or weekly.
- Communicate with students seeking homework to catch up on any lessons missed.
- Check homework of students on a regular basis.
- Communicate with parents when students are regularly failing to meet homework expectations.

Parent Responsibilities:

- Discuss homework with their child.
- Provide a suitable workplace.
- Support students to develop time-management skills. This may include establishing a routine for homework and creating a study plan for students.
- Encourage and support students as required.
- Checking some homework items. This may include proof reading assessment items. Parents may not know the subject matter well but parents will still be able to form a judgement on the quality of the work.
- Contact the teacher concerned when in doubt about what is expected of their students.
- Ensure students have a balanced approach to their school work.
